General Rules and Conditions

- ✓ All competitors must be currently enrolled in an ICCES Member School
- ✓ All riders must be accompanied by an adult
- ✓ No riders other than those competing are allowed to ride at the equestrian centre
- ✓ All riders must wear approved yellow-tagged helmets and boots at all times whilst mounted. Helmets MUST be tagged.
- ✓ Full school equestrian uniform must be worn
- ✓ Schools are responsible for gear check
- ✓ Riders to provide own bridle / saddle number
- ✓ One class includes a dressage test and jumping round. Riders are only permitted to compete in one class per combination
- ✓ All dressage tests are ridden in a 60m x 20m arena
- ✓ One rider per horse rule applies
- ✓ In the event of equal placings in a test, the higher collective marks will be placed higher. If the collective marks are the same, then equal place will be given
- ✓ Dogs are not allowed at this event
- ✓ All Equestrian Victoria Interschool competitions are governed under Victoria's Child Safe Legislation and Equestrian Australia's Child Safeguarding Policy. It is expected all competitors, parents, judges, volunteers, and any engaged services to participate under these guidelines. All EA and EV events are subject to the EA Code of Conduct.
- ✓ It is important that all members understand that the Code of Conduct also covers parents, guardians, and spectators in respect of any activity held or sanctioned by EV or an EA state branch. A key aim of the Code of Conduct is to respect the rights of everyone involved, to abide by all EA rules and requirements, to be fair, considerate, honest and professional in all aspects of the sport.
